“Homing pigeons” are a kind of bird that can find their way home from far places — sometimes as far away as 1,800 kilometers! Throughout history, they’ve been used to carry messages, which were usually written on thin pieces of paper and wrapped around one of their legs. Homing pigeons were especially useful when there were no other ways to send messages, for example, during times of war.



People used to think that the pigeons were naturally able to know directions, but a recent study has discovered that the birds are also following roads and landmarks, just like humans do when traveling from place to place. Scientists at Oxford University were surprised when they noticed that some pigeons were flying along big streets and clearly turning off at certain intersections or using big buildings to remember where they were, especially when flying in areas they knew very well. Of course, this doesn’t mean that they always travel like humans. Since they’re able to fly high above the buildings and busy streets, they don’t always have to choose the same way as humans. They take shortcuts, when they can, just like any other birds would do.

Scientists also think that the homing pigeons use the sun to understand where they’re going when they have to travel in areas they don’t know very well, just like humans used to do when traveling long ago.

These days, e-mail may be a more popular way to send messages than homing pigeons. But homing pigeons can still help people, especially when there are disasters, and there are no other ways to send messages. This is all thanks to their talent for finding their way home.

E.B. White was an American writer who began writing when he was very young and continued writing his whole life. He moved to New York City in 1924 to begin writing for a popular magazine. But after 15 years of life in New York City, White decided to move to a farm in Maine.

He had always been interested in animals, and as he watched the animals on his farm, he got ideas for some new books—children’s books. The main characters in these books were animals, and people could all learn valuable lessons from the stories.

In his book *Stuart Little*, he tells the story of a mouse that lived with a human family in New York City. Though the mouse may have looked quite different from the rest of the family, they never treated him any differently. One message for readers could be that everyone is unique in their own way, so it’s important to be confident and happy with who you are.

*Charlotte’s Web*, another children’s book by White, is about a pig and a spider who live on a farm. Although they are different kinds of animals, they become very good friends, and one of the animals even saves the life of the other. From this, readers could learn that friendship is important, and that you can have friends that are quite different from you.

Though White wrote many great works, he is remembered most for his books for children—American classics that are still enjoyed by many people, from young to old. By looking to the animal world for examples, White found a way to share his thoughts on how people can have better lives.

As they slowly studied the dishes on the shelf, Cindy spotted a small, gray vase. Something about it touched her heart, so she decided to pay 20 dollars for it.


Julie was surprised and said, “I think a dollar would be too much!”
